- The political climate of the last 5 years
- Host countries-specific requirements may limit or promote mobility
- Revised South African legislation
- Stance of partnering institutions is not always reciprocal in nature







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- Know administrative systems
- Ensure that the student is registered at both institutions
- Perceptions of bureaucracy
- Ethics and project approval
- Establish a feasible co'tutelle with clear responsibilities assigned
- Know the deal breakers
- Force majeure







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- Clarify mobility requirements
- The demographic profile of the African PhD student is vastly different
- The culture of Higher education and pursuit of PhD is vastly different
- Revisit the focus on PhD mobility and focus on pipeline development
- Non-return of mobile students
- Mobility at home







of hope, action & knowledge

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- Funding is decreasing
- Exchange rates prejudice North-South mobility
- Subsistence and accommodation are often not covered
- Costly medical aid requirements
- Accompanying dependents must demonstrate financial independence





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- Supervisory dyads change into supervisory teams (Range: 3-8)
- Supervisory teams must clearly delineate roles and responsibilities
- Project-based teams with existing relationships fare better
- Unidirectional conceptualization of capacity building





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- Expectation of availability
- ICT vulnerabilities including Unequal access to devices & ICT readiness
- Hiding behind the bandwidth
- Enhanced business continuity
- MOOCS, repositories, Open Source
- Library access









Internationalization remains a powerful process that could leapfrog participation in HE with the advances in IT and technology.

- Clarify the contextual needs
- Critically appraise where the game changing intervention would take place
- Internationalization has not increased participation in HE
- Modest success in reducing time to degree
- Sustainability of interventions not optimal
