

 - ✓ Centre for Quality of Health & Living
 - Centre for Rapid Prototyping and Manufacturing (CRPM)







- The RD & PGS section fulfils five core functions in the Research, Innovation and Engagement Portfolio in support of the academic project. These five functions are:
 - The general administration of research and postgraduate studies
 - The awarding, administration, monitoring and evaluation of internal and external postgraduate students and staff grants and scholarships
 - The development of research skills through workshops and mentorship programmes





- The promotion of research ethics and integrity in scholarly work
- Policies at CUT which supports PhD life cycle e.g. Sabbatical for support staff
- International Credit Mobility for PhD students

Institutional challenges

- 1. Supervision capacity and appropriate mentors
 - Ratio of early career researchers to established researchers
 - ✓ quality of M+D students
 - proposal writing
 - Scientific writing
 - publications in high impact journals



Institutional challenges

- 2. Grow "seniority" of academic staff profile 1/3 staff has doctorates
 - research leave and funding for teaching replacements
 - ability of PhD's to apply for external funding (too dependent on the NRF)



Breaking the Cycle of Dependency

Institutional challenges

- 3. Grow number of completed M+D projects – concern of relevance to socio-economic development
- 4. Delayed registration process; taking up of International Credit Mobility Grant
- 5. PhD candidates Gender equality







Socio-Economic Development Strategies That Work



- Supervision of international students via MoUs with Great Zimbabwe University and Ho Technical university in Ghana
- Limited international collaborations w.re. to PhD programmes
 - despite MOUs with international partners






- Lack of international experience regarding joint PhD programmes
- Lack of collaboration and exchange knowhow w.r.e to joint PhDs
 - Limited knowledge of internationalization of research



- Workload of current supervision staff
- Insufficient time to supervise students
- Insufficient experts required for supervision





- Lack of knowledge on joint PhD offering models & types
- Limited exposure to international PhD programmes
- Limited resource allocated to internationalization

- Our students lack writing skills
- Our students lack international exposure

- Our students require office space for PG students at faculty level





- Expose staff members to the concept of joint PhD offering
- Increase staff supervision capacity in the faculties
- Provide opportunities for international collaboration, which is backed by resources
- Revise the workload model to allow quality supervision
- Enhance the administration of the PhD Life Cycle





- Implement a professional development programme for PhD candidates and supervisors
- Enhance supervisory capability through assistance from international partners
- Enhance infrastructure and governance systems with international partners
